Unacceptable Masks



Vented N95 products, bandanas, and gaiters must be substituted with a surgical/procedural mask.

Face shields are not an acceptable alternative to a surgical/procedural mask (exceptions may be permitted on a case by case basis).

Note: Do not damage the surgical/procedural mask integrity (e.g. poke holes or otherwise alter). This will reduce source control effectiveness.
